- 1. Proposed Conservator (the person who will be in charge):
 - a. Full name
 - b. Address
 - c. All telephone numbers, home, work, cell
 - d. Date of Birth
 - e. Social Security Number
 - f. Relationship to proposed conservatee.
- 2. Proposed Conservatee (the person who needs to be taken care of):
 - a. Full name
 - b. Address if different from conservator
 - c. Date of Birth
 - d. Social Security Number
 - e. Describe in detail the physical or mental disabilities of the person.
 - f. Is a conservatorship needed for health care decisions only, or also for asset management? Why? Why cannot the proposed conservatee take care of themselves either physically or financially?
 - g. Name, relationship and address of each relative within the 2nd degree. I.e., all children, parents, spouse, siblings, grandchildren.
 - h. Doctor's name and address.
